FABRY DISEASE FACTS

Cause

- Congenital accumulation storage disease
- Deficiency of a specific enzyme in the special substructures within each cell, the so-called lysosomes

Frequency of disease

- 1 in 40,000 men
- 1 in 20,000 women

Key symptoms

- Burning pain in hands and feet
- Little or no perspiration
- Reddish-purple skin rashes
- Gastrointestinal discomfort

- Impaired renal function
- Cardiac arrhythmias
- Strokes in patients under 55

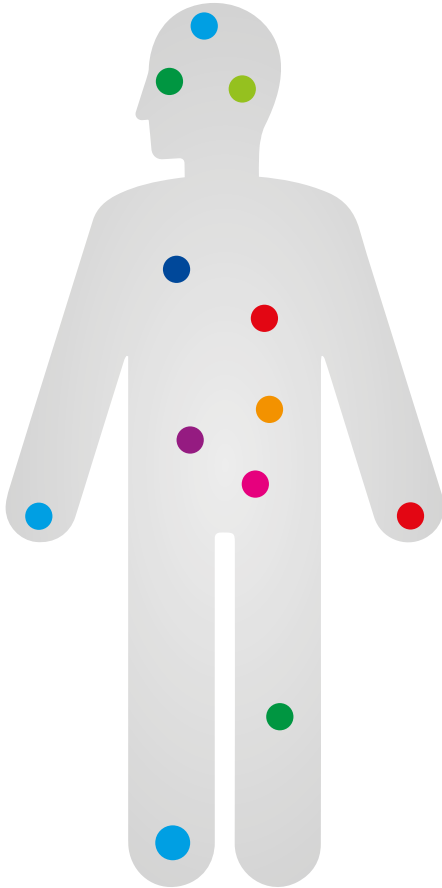
Diagnosis

- Men: Blood test
- Women: Gene analysis

Therapy options

- Enzyme replacement therapy (infusion)
- Chaperone therapy (capsules)

SYMPTOMS OF FABRY DISEASE



Brain

- Stroke

Mental discomfort

- Fatigue, listlessness
- Confusion
- Depression

Nervous system

- Burning pain on hands and feet
- Pain radiating into other parts of the body
- Joint pain
- Headache

Eyes

- Clouding of cornea/lens
- Alteration of vessels

Musculoskeletal system

- Uncoordinated gait
- Movement disorders

Ears

- Loss of hearing
- Tinnitus
- Dizziness

Lungs

- Shortness of breath
- Wheezing breathing sounds

Heart

- Shortness of breath due to enlarged heart
- Irregular heartbeat
- Palpitation

Nieren

- Frequent urination
- Proteinuria (in severe cases detectable by foaming)

Gastrointestinal tract

- Pain
- Diarrhoea
- Nausea, vomiting

Blutgefäße

- Fingers and sometimes toes turning white or blue

Skin

- Small, dark red skin elevations
- Oedema (swelling through water deposits)
- Dry skin, little or no perspiration
- Sensitivity to heat, fever
